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Attendance

- National Workshop attendance included:
- 12 NGOs- 25 women
- 4 stakeholders- Crown Prosecution Service (CPS-2 areas- female) , police (male) and Government's Forced Marriage Unit (FMU-male)
- Total people in attendance: 27
- Telephone consultations with 5 NGOs (5 women)
- Total consulted: 32 people; 17 NGOs; 4 others
- Total gender: 2 men and 30 women



Research Feedback

- Fatima project important initiative
- Minority NGOs need capacity building, training on HRV and human rights, and training for trainers
- Balance training for community and professionals
- Charging for training will help sustainability, particularly with cuts in funding
- Training should reflect local and country needs, and of different audiences eg community v professionals; UK needs more in-depth training, diversity
- Project needs more resources- more time needed for training of and supporting NGOs, payments to NGO, pay NGOs not included so that they too can participate
- Set up training network, but this is not resourced
- Imp. research highlights need for more funding for minority women's NGOs



NGO Profile

- Ensure the NGO delivering the training have some awareness of HRV and human rights
- NGOs should have aware of the services in their area
- Training should have a human rights perspective
- Ensure oral interpretation is available -more important than translated written materials
- Decide which audience to focus on- community or professionals, or both



Training Content & Tools

- Use the human rights framework- different forms of inequalities, rights and the law
- Definition of HRV, how HRV affects victims and communities, the law, practical guidance and how to obtain help
- Presentations- useful for overview
- Group discussions – gives ‘voice’/dialogue
- Case studies- learning from experience
- Theatre, role play, (social) media/DVDs, games
